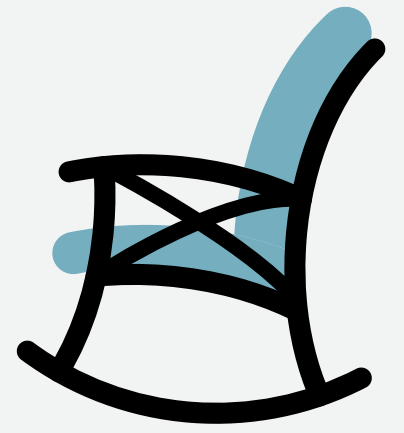




The rise in long-term care

1.3 million are in nursing homes.

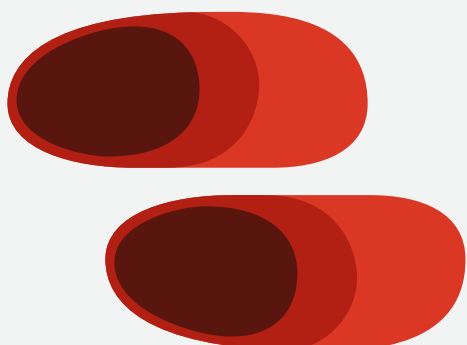
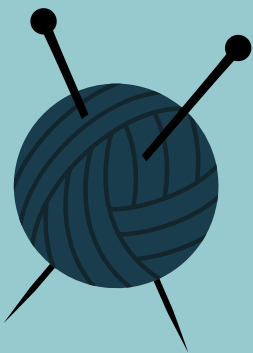
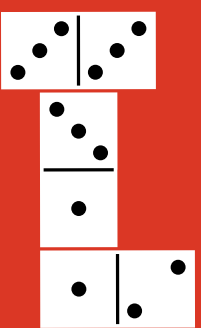
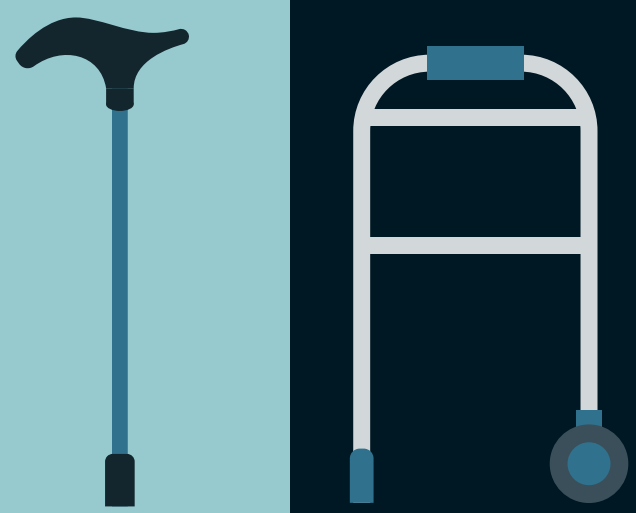
The number of nursing-home residents may double by 2030 if current trends continue. Causes for increase in long-term care, include:
